Govt, oppn may call a truce to pass disabilities bill in LS today

New Delhi: Amid the heightened acrimony between opposition and government there is a small possibility that the disabilities bill, passed by Rajya Sabha on Wednesday, may go through Lok Sabha on Friday as part of a truce.
