

Rights to Indian Sign Language to be added as an amendment the constitution of India

Rights to Indian Sign Language, Cultural and Educational

- (a) The rights of persons using Indian sign language and of persons in need of interpretation or translation aid owing to deaf people shall be guaranteed by an Act
- (b) Right to culture Cultural and customary values which are consistent and with the Constitution may be developed and incorporated in aspects of India's life. The State shall-
- (c) Promote and preserve those cultural values and practices which enhance the dignity and wellbeing of Indian, Human dignity
- (d) Encourage the development, preservation and enrichment of all Indian Sign language.
- (e) Promote and encourage the development of an Indian Sign Language for the Deaf in India.

National Anthem of Indian Sign Language

The national anthem of Indian to be determined by law shall reflect the ideals of the Constitution, the Commitment of the Peoples of Indian to live together in a democratic order and of their common destiny.

Rights to Indian Sign Language

1. All Indian Sign language shall enjoy equal states recognition.
2. Indian Sign language shall be the working language of the Central Government and States.
3. Members of the Central and States may by law determine their respective working languages
